





#### Report of our -th jubilee



Dear hostfamilies and best twin town interested,

It is behind us, our 25th anniversary. And what has it been a nice anniversary?

I want to let you enjoy this newsletter (for the host families) or let them know (for all those who still feel involved) how the past days have passed.

So, we start on October 4th. At about 22:00, after a long journey, the bus arrived with somewhat tired but enthusiastic guests at the Van der Valk hotel. The greeting was stormy in all respects. Host families were coupled as quickly as possible to guests, so as to allow the guests to acclimatize at home and prepare themselves for the coming days.



Thursday 5th of October became a well-filled day for our guests. For today there was a guided tour in the Westfries Museum, a visit to the Half Moon, a lunch at the WFM and a Virtual Reality performance in the WFM on the program.

The weather was unfortunately very Dutch. Fortunately, we were transported from one location to another "dry".



Despite the storm and rain, the mood remained well. During lunch at the WFM, director Ad Geerdink unexpectedly took the time to welcome our guests, which was greatly appreciated by all.



The visit to the Half Moon was interested for everyone. With the stormy weather, everyone could make a good impression of how a trip on this ship did not look like the current cruises. Especially the explanation ahead of the visit on the boat was clear and understandable.

The Virtual Reality performances in the WFM were also highly experienced. I was an observer this time and it was a lot of fun to see that heads went all the way during the show.











At the end of the afternoon, the sun shone for a while and we decided to continue the planned walk to the lighthouse. Unfortunately, in the middle of the dike, the rain came over us and everyone was soaked.

But with a good glass of beer and / or hot tea, this day was finally closed in all gratitude.

Our guests had their evening meal with the host family and many of us made sure that the bedroom was already visited quite early.

This evening our chairman picked up Mr Jindřich Vařeka, the mayor of Příbram, from Schiphol. He would be the guest of Mayor Jan Nieuwenburg at Jubileeday and after the anniversary celebrations he would go to Příbram again on Saturday morning.

**Friday 6th October** a small group had a "working" program and a free day for the majority.

The firemen from Příbram went to military airport De Kooij in Den Helder in the morning and the fire station in Hoorn in the afternoon.

The teacher and two students of the Gymnasium from Příbram followed lessons throughout the day and made contact for an exchange with the Copernicus school.

The head of the Příbram Free School went to visit the Westfriese Vrije School Parcival.

Head of the music school Příbram has contacted Gerard Boedijn Music School.

And finally, the mayor of Příbram, the head of the state archives of Příbram and the employee International Affairs, visited the Westfries Archive, with whom they are keen to realise an exchange together with the association Oud Hoorn.





Both mayors met for the first time at lunch in the Hoornse Hop restaurant.

Following this introduction, the chairman of the association Oud Hoorn led the group by, in particular, the construction projects that have grown in the inner city of Hoorn in the years

The walk was walked under sun rays that even heated us in Hoorn.



After that, it was time to go back to the host family or hotel and prepare for the jubilee evening held at Grand Café Turf

The evening had an informal character, with official parts, both speeches of mayors and handing over gifts. Příbram received a Unicorn seal of 500 euro for the further development of the Erasmus + project and an aerial view of the municipality of Hoorn. Hoorn received a photo of photo artist Jiří Jiroušek from Příbram Svata Hora. That will find a place in our city hall.

Our foundation also received a Unicorn stamp of 500 euro from the municipality of Hoorn.
